Introduction

We need this information in a yearly format, just as a traditional transcript describes work completed by year.

If you have not been working with an umbrella organization or you do not have a state-required portfolio that you can submit, you should complete the information requested on this form and send it along with your application to The Putney School. Please make sure to keep a copy, because at the end of the school year, you will have the opportunity to describe additional work completed. If you are accepted to The Putney School, this final portfolio will serve as the final transcript to submit to our Registrar's Office. At that time, your information will be officially evaluated to award credit for your work.

When you submit this Homeschool Portfolio, please include your work in all six disciplines for each year of high school for which you are requesting credit.


